

- Analyst (Freight Rate Specialist) \$28,500-\$52,300
- Customer Service Manager \$35,200-\$70,300
- Transportation Coordinator \$29,000-\$43,100
- Warehouse Outbound Operations Manager \$36,700-\$78,400

Middle Level Management


- International Logistics Manager \$39,600- \$100,100
